Game Operations Minutia, Meeting People Keep this Honorary Chair Coming Back Year-After-Year

The HAECO Invitational honorary chair is a person that made a significant commitment to the HAECO Invitational or the Greensboro Sports Council over the years. Brett Weathersbee has that covered. She joined the Council in 2013, chaired the HAECO Invitational in 2016 and '17, served as Sports Council president in 2021 and remains on the board of directors. But what sets her apart from most is her continued commitment to the HAECO Invitational. Tournament chairs come and go, but those who remain a part of tournament operations long after they chaired provide much needed institutional knowledge of how this prestigious event operates. We caught up with Brett on a break from preparing for this year's tournament.

Q: Why did you join the Sports Council in 2013?

A: From the time I was little, I always loved sports. I was born right after my parents graduated from N.C. State – State basketball and football games were part of my life. When I was little, my grandparents took me to Atlanta for a week every summer to see baseball games. I inherited my Dad's love of sports, but I did not inherit his athletic ability. When I was in middle school, I played a couple years of J.V. basketball and ran track, but I was horrible at all of it. I learned very quickly that I could get involved in sports by keeping the basketball book at the scorer's table or keeping the stat sheet for the track team. I could still get out of school early, go to all the events and hang out with all my friends who were athletic. I liked that behind-the-scenes stuff. I wasn't really involved in sports all through college, but we moved to Greensboro in 2007 around when my Dad joined the Sports Council. We worked in the same office. I watched what he was doing – the HAECO Invitational, serving as a team host for NC State. I was seeing all that and after a few years, I knew I wanted to do those things, too.

Q: What were the first GSC things you enjoyed doing?

A: The first two things I got involved in were courtesy transportation at the Wyndham Championship and the HAECO Invitational. Right after the 2013 HAECO Invitational, Worth Holleman asked me if I'd like to keep the HAECO Invitational sponsorship spreadsheet. I'd watched my Dad struggle with that for a few years, but I wanted to get involved. I did that until I co-chaired the tournament in 2016 and '17. I also got involved as a team host for ACC events along the way.



Q: What about this tournament keeps you coming back?

A: There's just something about this event. When you put so much into something, you have a vested interest in its success. One of my favorite parts is going to HAECO with the teams that played in the championship games and seeing some kids that have never been on a plane see one up close for the first time. I like experiencing that with them. And I still like the behind-the-scenes stuff. Seeing everything that goes into the event – all the things nobody thinks about like people at the scorer's table, stats people, official dressing rooms. I like all the minutia – it's kind of like a puzzle. It's the kind of thing I like to do. I enjoy thinking about things other people might not think about. That's why I've always liked proof-reading. It's not that I'm trying to think about things people forgot; I just like going through, in my mind, and asking, 'Have we covered everything? Have we thought of everything?'

I like all the people I get to meet being part of this team. I've met so many people through sports I wouldn't have met otherwise – like people at the ACC, for example. I hosted the Notre Dame women's golf team for a long time and got to know their equipment manager; she'd been at Notre Dame for like 25 years. When NC State played Notre Dame in football, our family went. I reached out to her, and we ended up tailgating together. She took us on an incredible tour – which was far better than the game, but that's a great example of something that wouldn't have happened without the Sports Council.

Q: Professionally, you're an attorney, but you also work with the family business?

A: I went to Davidson undergraduate and got a masters in international business at the University of South Carolina. Then I went to law school at Vanderbilt University and practiced in corporate law for a while in Columbia, S.C. When we relocated to Greensboro in 2007, I went to work with my parents. At the time we had five Steak 'n Shake restaurants, and Steak 'N Shake used to be a tournament partner with the halftime shootouts I think until COVID. We operate two restaurants now – one on Wendover Ave. and one in Greenville, S.C.

THE HAECO INVITATIONAL

GREENSBORO HOLIDAY TRADITION THRIVES

More than four decades ago, seven Greensboro Sports Council men had a vision: bring Greensboro's high school basketball teams together for a holiday tournament and donate the proceeds to the schools. It sounded like a pretty good idea when the inaugural HAECO Invitational was played back in 1976, and it's an idea that still sounds pretty good today.

Jim Betts, Lem Cox, Bradley Faircloth, Stanley Frank, Doug Galyon, Fred Joseph and E. Kemp Reece not only envisioned a tournament that would help fund the schools' athletic programs, they created it. At that time, the Greensboro Coliseum hosted the Big 4 Tournament, an annual affair among Duke, NC State, North Carolina and Wake Forest. These seven Sports Council visionaries realized they could make their vision a reality if they created a similar event among Greensboro's four city high schools, Dudley, Grimsley, Page and Smith, and in 1976, the Little 4 was born.

When Grimsley played Page and Dudley faced Smith in the first tournament games Dec. 28, 1976, organizers knew they had four good men's basketball teams, and they knew that with strong support from the community, they'd be able to return \$5,000 to each of the four schools. As it turned out, the event drew nearly 4,000 high school hoops fans to the Coliseum each night. Not bad for a holiday tournament that was no sure thing. The Greensboro Sports Council started the tournament as a two-day playoff, but it didn't take long to expand the field to eight schools and to add a women's tournament to the program. Despite changes along the way, the basics and mission of the event remained, and the holiday tournament's popularity and significance were strong.

Today, the HAECO Invitational is just that: an invitational tournament. The Greensboro Sports Council can invite different schools from year-to-year as long as they are located in or around Guilford County; Bishop McGuinness joined the field for the first time in 2022 after Southeast Guilford returned in 2021 following a decades-long absence. The mission remains, and the tournament thrives.

In addition to donating funds back to the schools, the Greensboro Sports Council awards four Bill Lee Scholarships to participating student athletes each year, and the Council makes charitable contributions as well. Following last year's tournament, the HAECO Invitational made a donation to Hands for Hearts; the outgoing tournament chair chooses the charity each year.

Some previous recipients of charitable donations made in honor of outgoing tournament chairs are Out of the Garden Project, Ready for School, Ready for Life, Greensboro Urban Ministries, Backpack Beginnings, the American Cancer Society's Coaches vs. Cancer, Friends for an Earlier Breast Cancer Test, Joseph's House, the Eastern Guilford High School Fund, the Joey Cheek Fund, the North Carolina State Games, the Girls and Boys Club, The First Tee of the Triad, Bryan Family YMCA, the Salvation Army, Youth Focus and the UNC Lineberger Comprehensive Cancer Center.

While the tournament remained focused on its original purpose, it also enjoyed some great basketball over the years, and last year's tournament added another chapter with first timer Bishop McGuinness winning the women's tournament. The Villains defeated Grimsley and Dudley before outlasting the Smith Golden Eagles 45-39 in the championship game. Smith High School defeated Ragsdale and Greensboro Day School on the way to the championship game.

The men's tournament was a familiar storyline as Greensboro Day School defeated Smith High School 64-50 to claim the title. The Bengals defeated Bishop McGuinness and Southeast Guilford on the way to the championship game. Smith defeated Page and Grimsley on its way to the title tilt. It was the 19th HAECO title for both coach Freddy Johnson and Greensboro Day School.

While the HAECO Invitational has evolved through the years in both title and teams, the original mission remains – support high schools in or around Guilford County. Deep community roots planted in a different century grow stronger each autumn when the familiar sounds of basketball shoes squeaking on high school hardwoods return - the HAECO Invitational must be on the horizon.

THE FOUNDERS TROPHY:

HAECO INVITATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY

The HAECO Invitational trophy is named the Founders Cup. The trophy, presented to the men's and women's champions each year, is named in honor of the seven Greensboro Sports Council members who was most responsible for founding this Greensboro holiday high school tradition. To the founders of the tournament created as the Little 4 Invitational in 1976, thank you. The seven founders of the HAECO Invitational are below:

JIM BETTS



Jim Betts, a faithful and ardent supporter of sports in our area, is a past president of the Greensboro Sports Council and a past chairman of the HAECOisHiring.com Invitational. Betts is also a past chairman of the Wyndham Championship, and a life member of the Greensboro Jaycees, which honored him with the Roy Cary Award. He is a former co-chairman of both the Southern Conference Soccer Championship and the ACC Golf Championship. He served as a director and vice chairman of the Central YMCA and is a past chairman of the Bryan Park Golf Commission.

Many other organizations in Greensboro have had the benefit of his leadership including the Greensboro Science Center, Greensboro Board of Education, Gateway Education Center, Greensboro Country Club, Shepherd Center of Greensboro and West Market Street United Methodist Church where he was Lay Leader. He was vice chairman of the board of directors of N.C. Grange Mutual Insurance Company.

Betts attended N.C. State University where he is a member of the Varsity Wolfpack Club and graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He owned E.K. Williams Company of North Carolina for 36 years before a successful switch to financial services. He is retired from Merrill Lynch.

LEM COX



Over a 40-year career in education, Lem Cox demonstrated his deep commitment to youth and sports. He holds degrees from East Carolina University and Vanderbilt University and worked as a teacher and coach in the public schools of both Virginia and North Carolina. Cox is probably best known to Greensboro residents as the long-time City Athletic Director in the Greensboro City Schools, a position he held until 1993. Cox has also served as the Director of the Internship Program at Greensboro College.

The Greensboro Sports Council is just one of his many community involvements. Cox is also a member and Elder of the Presbyterian Church of the Covenant.

BRADLEY E. FAIRCLOTH



Bradley E. Faircloth passed away on Aug. 25, 2012. He spent a lifetime ensuring athletic success and fairness on the athletic field and was involved in football officiating for more than 45 years. He was appointed Assistant Commissioner and Supervisor of Football Officials for the Atlantic Coast Conference in 1983. A native of Fayetteville, N.C., he received the Collegiate Commissioners Football Officials Award of Merit and was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. A longtime ACC official, Faircloth officiated more than 200 games in his career including seven major bowl games, the North Carolina-South Carolina Shrine Bowl, the North Carolina East-West All-Star games and the NAIA Championship.

He traveled extensively in Europe conducting officiating clinics for the U.S. Air Force. In 1991, he assisted in the establishment of a scholarship program in the Triad area for high school football players who distinguished themselves academically, athletically and in the community; hundreds of student athletes have been awarded scholarships. Faircloth was honored when

his name was added to that of former Atlantic Coast Conference Commissioner Gene Corrigan in establishing the Gene Corrigan/Bradley Faircloth Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame.

Faircloth was a past president of the Greensboro Sports Council and a past chairman of the GGO, now the Wyndham Championship. The City of Greensboro selected him as an outstanding civic leader; he received the Service to Youth Award and the Distinguished Service Award from the Salvation Army.

STANLEY FRANK



Stanley Frank, a keen supporter of the HAECO Invitational, passed away on Jan. 2, 2006. He was a former president of the Greensboro Sports Council who worked tirelessly in a number of community endeavors. Frank came to Greensboro in 1936 to rescue a faltering business, Carolina By-Products, which he eventually purchased and became its president, chairman and Chief Executive Officer before retiring.

Frank was president of the Greensboro Chamber of Commerce, chairman of the United Community Services (now United Way), honorary chairman of the Greater Greensboro Open, now the Wyndham Championship, the first chairman of the Guilford County Zoning Committee and a trustee of Guilford College, where he established the Frank Scholarship. He served as a director and chairman of the development committee of the N.C. Symphony, director of Boy Scouts of America, director and past chairman of the First Union National Bank board of directors, member of the American Business Club, director of First Mortgage Insurance and a member of the Wake Forest Board of Visitors.

Frank was perhaps best known as chairman of the Greensboro-High Point Airport Authority, a precursor to the Piedmont Triad Airport Authority. He served on the board longer than any of its other members and became Chairman in 1972. He also served as Secretary of the North Carolina Department of Transportation's Aeronautics Council.

Frank received the chamber's Distinguished Citizen Award, a brotherhood citation from the National Conference of Christians and Jews and an honorary Doctor of Humanities degree from Wake Forest University in 1981. He was honored for his civic leadership by the Interclub Council, a coalition of Greensboro's civic clubs, in 1984.

DOUG GALYON



Doug Galyon, the former chairman of the North Carolina Board of Transportation, passed away on April 7, 2019. Galyon served on the North Carolina Board of Transportation for 17 years, including nine as chairman. He was the 1975 Greensboro Sports Council president, the 1996 HAECOisHiring.com Invitational honorary chairman and the 1988 Wyndham Championship honorary chairman. He served on the Greensboro City Council, the Guilford County Board of Commissioners and the Greensboro Coliseum Commission. He was vice-chairman for economic development for Greensboro Area Chamber of Commerce. His memberships, in addition to the Greensboro Sports Council, included the Greensboro Rotary Club, the N.C. Textile Manufacturers Association board of directors, United Arts Council board of directors and the planning division for the United Way of Greater Greensboro.

Galyon also served on the UNC-Greensboro Excellence Foundation Board, the Board of Visitors at Greensboro College and Guilford College and the Greensboro Rotary Club. He was a life member of the Greensboro Jaycees, the Duke University Iron

Dukes and the recipient of the Greensboro Chamber of Commerce's Distinguished Citizen Award.

Galyon attended Duke University and was a 1953 graduate of Guilford College. He served in the United States Marine Corp from 1954-'56 and retired from Guilford Mills after a successful career in the textile industry. The State of North Carolina awarded Galyon its highest honor, The Order of the Long Leaf Pine, in 2000. Four years later, the City of Greensboro honored Galyon for his service to the community by dedicating the city's newly-renovated transportation center The J. Douglas Galyon Depot.

FRED I. JOSEPH



Fred I. Joseph was a vital supporter of athletics in our community. After joining the Greensboro Sports Council in 1960, Joseph served as its president as well as both chairman and later honorary chairman of the HAECO Invitational. He passed away January 13, 2022.

Joseph was a graduate of North Carolina State University and served on both the alumni board and the athletic council of N.C. State. Locally, he was chairman of the Guilford County Wolfpack Club for 20 years. He was an active supporter of sports at Page High School serving as a volunteer football coach and president of the Booster Club. Joseph founded the Booster Club at Greensboro College, which honored him with the Joseph Athletic Award now presented annually to the outstanding male and female athletes at the college. He served as a Trustee of Louisburg College for 20 years.

Joseph enjoyed a successful career with Shenandoah Life Insurance Company and was recognized as a member of the Million Dollar Round Table numerous times. He was also a past president of the Greensboro Association of Life Underwriters.

E. KEMP REECE



E. Kemp Reece passed away on July 6, 2012. He was an outstanding supporter of athletics and the community. Reece was a member of the Greensboro Sports Council for more than 40 years and served as Treasurer and President of the Sports Council and later an Emeritus Director. Kemp's other community activities were extensive. He was active in his Kiwanis Club where he served as President and Lieutenant Governor of the Carolinas District. He served on the board of directors for the Greensboro Symphony and chaired the Endowment Committee. Reece was a past trustee of Greensboro College and former president of the board of associates at Meredith College.

A native of Jonesville, N.C., Reece earned degrees from Wake Forest University and the University of Chicago Investment Banking School. In his investment business career he was Vice President and former Branch manager of Interstate/Johnson Lane in Greensboro. He retired in 1999 as Vice President of J.C. Bradford Investment Firm.

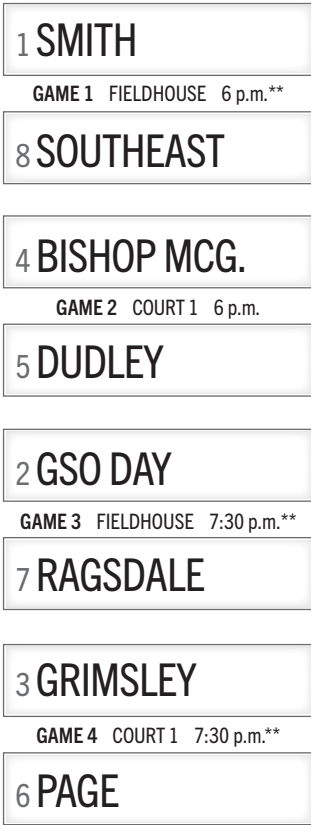

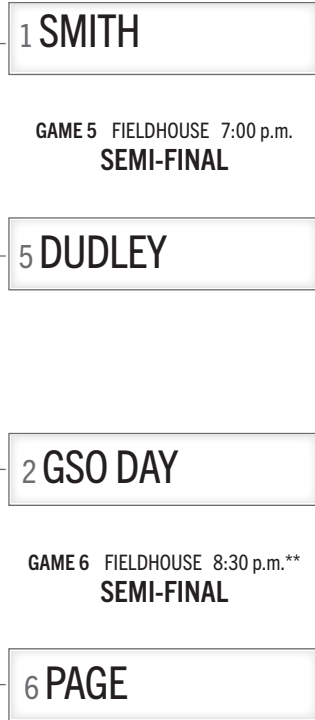

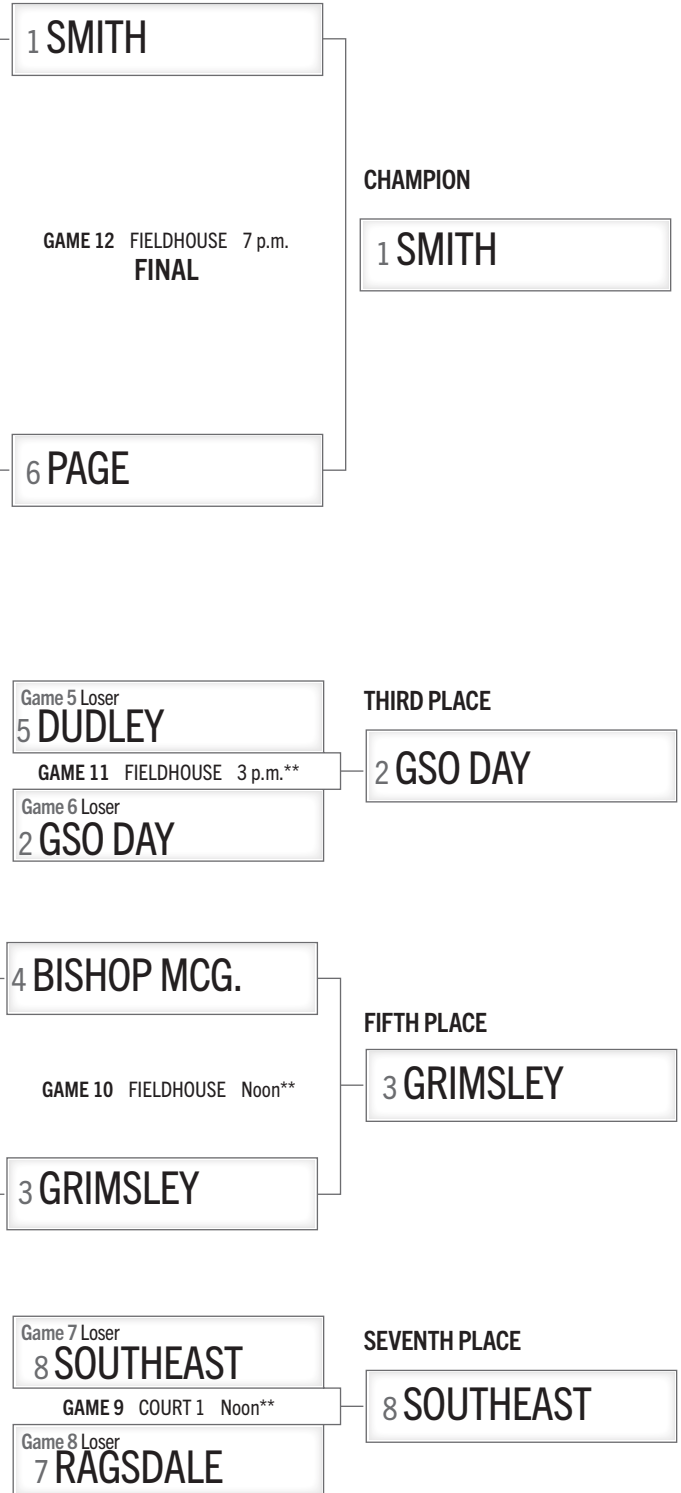

THE BILL LEE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

IN MEMORY OF BILL LEE
1950–2001



Bill Lee was born in Greensboro on November 28, 1950 and lived in the Gate City all his life. He attended Bessemer Elementary School and Bessemer Junior High School before graduating from Page High School in 1969. He went on to graduate from UNC-Pembroke in 1973 with a degree in Political Science. One year later, he married Theresa O'Rourke; the couple had three children, Mary Beth, Brian and Matt.

Bill's business career began in 1974 when he worked as a marketing representative for People Magazine. Five years later, Lee started his own company, Periodical Management and Marketing (PPM), a magazine marketing and merchandising company hired by retail chains to process and collect rebates offered by magazine publishers.

In 1995, Lee's successful company, PPM, merged with a competitor to form The Source Information Management Company, known today as Source Interlink Companies, a \$1 billion marketing, merchandising and fulfillment company of entertainment products in North America. After 25 years in the periodicals industry, Lee retired from the Source Interlink Co. in 1999 to pursue other business interests.

Between 1999 and 2001, Lee was an owner or partner in several bar and restaurant franchises. Lee was a major advocate of Greensboro's downtown revitalization and development and a major part of Greensboro's professional baseball efforts. In 2000, as a general partner of Greensboro's minor league team, he was instrumental in negotiating a contract extension with the New York Yankees through the 2002 season. A new baseball stadium in downtown Greensboro was a dream and vision that Lee championed as an owner of the local team. A plaque honoring Lee's many contributions to professional baseball in Greensboro adorns the outside of the Edgeworth Street wall of First National Bank Field downtown.

Bill Lee had a favorite saying which defined the way he lived his life: Live every day like it's your last but always plan for tomorrow. Lee died on February 4, 2001 following a courageous three-year battle with cancer.

The \$1,000 Bill Lee Memorial Scholarship was established by the Greensboro Sports Council following Lee's death in 2001, but in 2010, the scholarship amount doubled to \$2,000. Recipients are nominated by the schools participating in the HAECO Invitational each year, and the Greensboro Sports Council, in conjunction with the Community Foundation of Greater Greensboro, awards the scholarships. Each nomination is considered with the following criteria: 40% academic, 40% athletic and 20% civic. As many as four student-athletes receive a scholarship each year.*

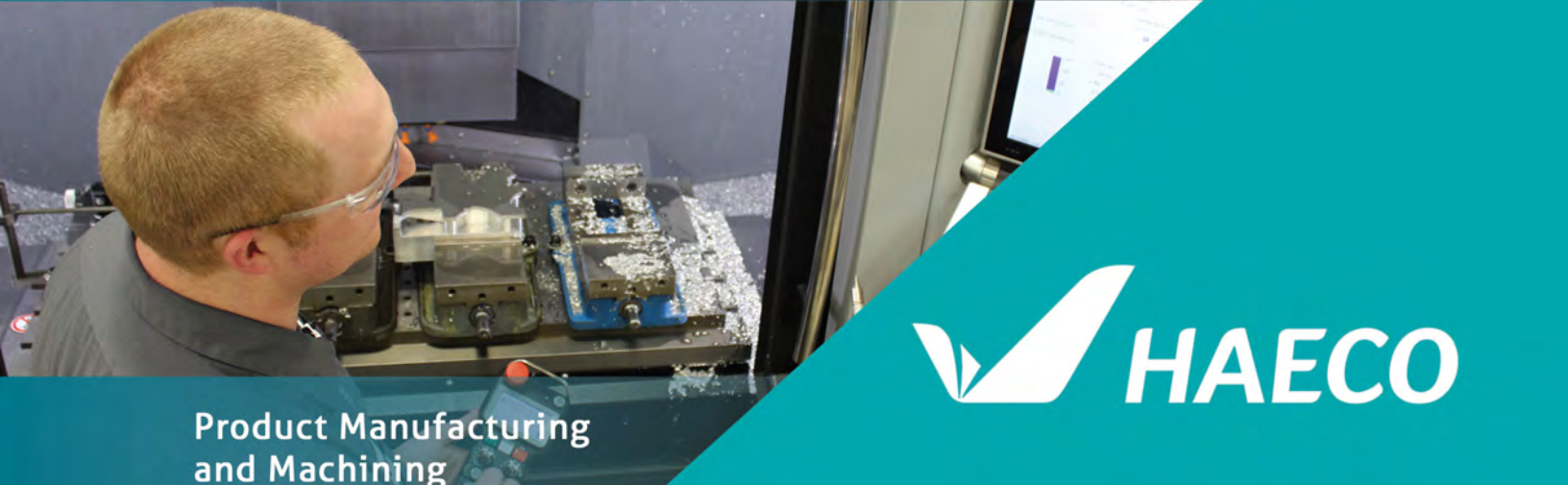

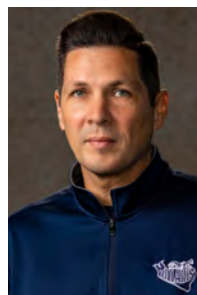

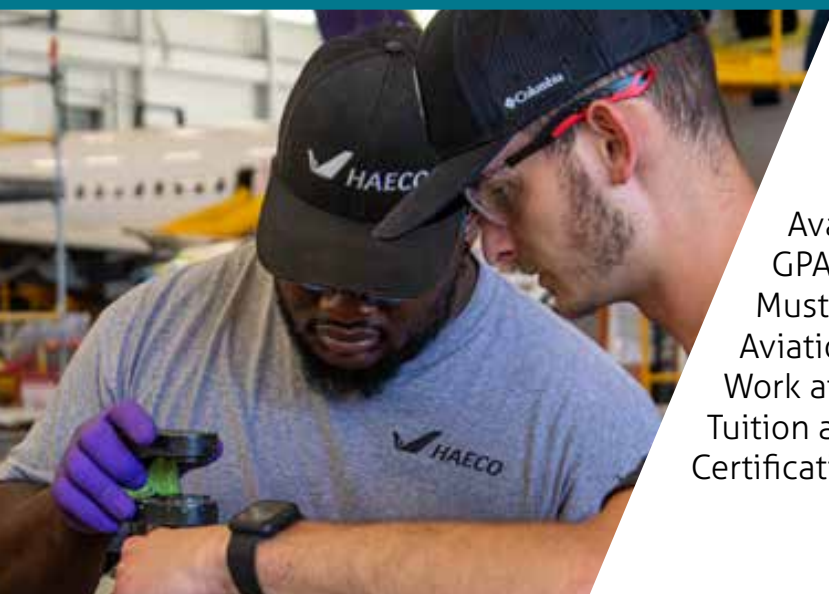
